Today you will drive from Queenstown to Wanaka. The approximate time to travel this distance is 1 hr 40 min (117 km).

From Queenstown to Wanaka, there are two options; you can either travel over the Crown Range on State highway 89 (60 minutes) which affords fabulous views, or if you would prefer to take a flatter but longer route (90 minutes), you can travel via the Kawarau Gorge and Bendigo.

This route takes you out of Queenstown on State Highway 6 and was once one of the most successful mining areas in the Otago region. There is a 20 minute walk exploring the old mine region – ensure you stay to the track as some of the shafts can be as deep as 160m and can be quite hidden from view. You will pass by the Goldfields Mining centre, where you can try your luck panning for gold in the Kawarau Gorge. The Kawarau Swing Bridge is also the location of the first ever commercial bungy jump world wide – just in case you are feeling like a rush of adrenalin!

Both of these routes have been marked on the map included in your documentation.

This private tour takes you high into the hills of Wanaka which has recently been voted as one of the 10 most romantic locations in the world making it the perfect location to impress your loved one.

Friday 06 February 2015

Fox Glacier

Today you will drive from Wanaka to Fox Glacier. The approximate time to travel this distance is 3 hr 45 min (264 km). Please refer to the map included in your documentation for the route we recommend you travel.

You may feel regretful about pulling away from the shore of beautiful Lake Wanaka, but there is no occasion for regrets as you are heading into a wonderful scenic area as you travel through the Haast Pass to the West Coast.

Driving through the Haast Pass

The Haast Pass road follows an ancient trail used by Maori travelling to the West Coast in search of pounamu/greenstone/jade/nephrite. The name for the trail is Tiora-patea, meaning "The way is clear". The Haast Pass is the lowest across the Main Divide (563 metres above sea level).

A gold prospector called Charles Cameron is considered to be the first European to find the pass. He went alone to the West Coast wanting to reach there by the most direct route from Dunedin, and crossed the pass in January 1863. He buried his powder flask to the west of the pass. Close behind him came Julius von Haast. His party of five found the journey very difficult with constant rain and flooded rivers which slowed their progress and led to a shortage of food. Haast named the pass after himself and claimed to be the first European to have travelled through it, but the discovery of Cameron's flask discredited this claim.

Now with a sealed road travelling through the pass offers easy motoring and there are a number of well-marked walks along the way.

Blue Pools – a 15-minute walk one way through silver beech forest to crystal-clear pools in the Blue River. Swing bridge over the Makarora River (70 km from Wanaka).

Cameron Creek- a 10-minute walk one way through mountain silver beech forest to a lookout and views of Makarora Valley (70 km from Wanaka).

Bridle Track - a well graded walk (1.5 hours one way) through beech forest following an old packhorse track between Haast Pass and Davis Flat. This track used to be used regularly in 1880's, and only a little imagination is required to envisage how tough conditions were for those travelling this route back then.

Thunder Creek Falls - a 2-minute walk (wheelchair access) through silver beech-podocarp rainforest just below the Gates of Haast Bridge, for a view of a 28 metre waterfall. Also regularly seen in this area are Kea, Kaka and other bird life.


Roaring Billy - the walk to these falls takes 25 minutes return, but it is well worth taking the time as there are interesting ferns along the track. At the end of the track there is a good view of the falls across the Haast River.

If time permits, you may be able to see penguins at Monro Beach near Lake Moeraki. Look out for the signs off SH 6 as you head north between Haast and Lake Paringa. An easy 40minute walk through coastal forest will take you to the remote beach where between July and December Fiordland crested penguin may be seen in the surf and on the beach.

Please be aware that the Haast Pass is closed from Makarora every night at 6:30pm and we recommend that you travel over the Haast Pass before 4:00pm to ensure you are able to reach the other side before the road closes. Makarora is located approximately a 1 hour drive from Wanaka.

Location Map and Accommodation Details for Distinction Fox Glacier – Te Weheka Boutique Hotel

Once you have passed through Haast, you will reach Knights Point with its spectacular coast line stretching endlessly towards Fox Glacier. The road parallels with the coast off and on until you make the final turn inland heading past the Karangarua and the start of the Copland valley before the final 26kms to Fox Village itself. Distinction Fox Glacier – Te Weheka Boutique Hotel is sited opposite the Department of Conservation headquarters, approximately 100m north of the shops and village centre.

Please check-in to the Fox Glacier Guiding office which is well signposted in the Fox Glacier Village at XXX for your XXX heli-hike. Your heli-hike has been pre-paid; please present your activity voucher when you check-in.

The fly-in, fly-out heli-hike combines the excitement of walking on Fox Glacier with the thrill of helicopter flights. By flying in you are able to access and explore a part of the glacier that is otherwise very difficult to get to. It is here, shunted between two ice falls, that the awesome glacier forces work hardest and often create spectacular ice caves and arches.

This trip includes:

- Two helicopter flights
- Guide
- Ground transport
- Leather boots
- Socks
- Crampons

Please bring:

- 3 - 4 layers of warm upper body clothing (jeans are not recommended on wet days, as they become very cold and uncomfortable to wear).

Saturday 07 February 2015

Westport

Today you will be driving from Fox Glacier to Westport. The approximate time to travel this distance is 4.5 hrs (296 km). Please refer to the map included in your documentation for the route we recommend you travel.

If you wish, you can head left onto Glacier Access Road in Franz Josef Township for 5 km towards the mountains along the Waiho River. From here two walks can be taken to gain excellent views of the glacier. The first is a ten minute climb to Sentinel Rock; at the end of the first 5km there is a forty-five minute walk to the terminal of the ice face.


En-route today if your time allows you can stop off in Hokitika. This was a bustling gold-mining town in the 1860's, with a population of over 6000. The passing of history can be viewed at the West Coast Historical Museum, in Hokitika on Tancred St.

19km east of Hokitika is the Lake Kaniere Scenic Reserve. This beautiful lake is 8km long and 2km wide with several picnic areas. The lake is surrounded by native bush except for 2 cleared areas of farmland. There are several walks available from the lake as well as swimming and kayaking.

Location Map and Accommodation Details for Birds Ferry Lodge

Birds Ferry Lodge is 8km North of Charleston. Drive North on State Highway 6 from Charleston. You will cross the (Little) Totara River then after crossing the Big Totara River drive slowly for a further 1.1km, at the top of the hill turn left into Birds Ferry Road.

Once on Birds Ferry Road follow the power poles for 1.8km, on the unsealed road, to the gate where a warm welcome awaits you. Take care using a GPS as Birds Ferry Road is not on all systems yet.



Location Map and Accommodation Details for The George

Travelling along Main South Rd (Route No 1) you will reach the suburb of Hornby, which is on the outskirts of Christchurch. Main South Rd will become Route 73 (Route No 1 will turn off on the left into Carmen Rd). Stay on Main South Rd until you come to the intersection of Main South Rd and Blenheim Rd. Turn right in to Blenheim Rd and stay on this road until you reach Moorhouse Avenue. Move in to the left hand lane and turn left at the lights in to Hagley Avenue. Follow Hagley Avenue to the end and continue through the traffic lights on to Oxford Terrace. Continue on Oxford Terrace, moving in to the left lane. Turn left in to Montreal Street until you approach Cranford Square then take the left fork on to Armagh St. Follow Armagh Street until it ends and turn right on to Park Terrace. Follow Park Terrace until you reach The George on the right situated on the corner of Park Terrace and Peterborough Street at 50 Park Terrace. Travelling time from Hornby is about 20 minutes.



Please make your way to the Dolphin Encounters booking office at Encounter Kaikoura at the address above for the check-in time confirmed yesterday. Please present your pre-paid voucher on check-in.

The Dusky dolphins inhabit the coastal waters off Kaikoura all year round, making Kaikoura a unique place in the world where wild dolphins can be encountered every day, weather permitting. You might be lucky enough to see other marine mammals apart from the Dusky dolphins such as Orca (killer whales), Pilot whales, New Zealand fur seals and Hector's dolphins.

Tours have a total duration of approximately 3 ½ hours and a complete guided commentary is given throughout the tour. The boats are fitted with toilets for your comfort and have covered areas for protections against the elements. All snorkelling gear and wetsuits are provided. Please bring a gear bag, swimsuit, towel, warm clothing and camera plus plenty of film.

After your dolphin swim you will have time for lunch before your afternoon whale watch tour.



Driving Directions to Waimangu Valley

Driving south of Rotorua along State Highway 5 (the Rotorua-Taupo Highway) look out for the Waimangu Volcanic Valley signs 14 km from Rotorua – turn left into Waimangu Road. Then drive 6 km along Waimangu Road to the entrance and car park.

Your Waimangu Volcanic Valley walk or hike takes you on an ecology-focused adventure of the craters of this beautiful valley. As you walk through the youngest eco-systems in the world you will view a range of geothermal activity, native plants and bird-life, an activity not to be missed. At any stage of your walk you can take the courtesy shuttle bus, which regularly circles the valley, back to the Waimangu Visitor Centre.

Easy Walking

There are many walks, mainly downhill, for you to choose from. You will see Echo Crater, and Frying Pan Lake, the world's largest hot water spring. The mysterious and dramatic Inferno Crater and its beautiful blue hot lake will take your breath away. Enjoy the serenity of New Zealand native bush. You will see newly forming silica terraces and rare and unusual thermal plants.

Mt Haszard Hiking Trail

Opened in January 2005, the Mt Haszard Hiking Trail follows parts of the original Waimangu Round Trip walking route from the early 1900's when tourists came to view the Waimangu Geyser erupting. The Mt Haszard Hiking Trail begins at Inferno Crater and moves high above the Waimangu Volcanic Valley floor. This nature hike provides spectacular panoramic views of the valley. We do not recommend this trail for children, pushchairs or wheelchairs.

Lake Rotomohana Cruise

Enjoy a boat cruise on Lake Rotomahana. This beautiful lake has its own separate geothermal system, with the amazing thermal activity that can only be seen from our vessel during your boat cruise. One of New Zealand's most beautiful, unspoilt, natural wilderness areas, the lake and surrounding land are protected from development.

What to Bring and Wear

Please wear flat shoes or sandals and bring your camera, comfortable clothing, rain or sun protection as necessary and a baby pushchair if needed. For the advanced hiking option, good walking shoes with treaded soles are recommended.

Te Whakarewarewa
